


CMAQ Updates

- Action Item: Establish CMAQ Sub-Commitee
- How the RPC can help
 - Developing Letters-of-Support for Select Boards to sign
 - Project Development
 - Application Assistance
- Communities from our region submitted 12 projects, representing
 7 towns/cities
 - Examples Include:
 - Public EV Charging Stations
 - Municipal Fleet Electrification
 - Bike/Ped Facility Projects
 - Park and Ride



- NHDOT Scoring Criteria
 - Project Readiness and Support (15 points maximum)
 - Financial Readiness: (15 points maximum)
 - Stewardship / Sustainability: (Maximum 25 points)
 - Air Quality Benefits: (Maximum 35 points)
 - Regional Ranking: (Maximum 10 points)

CMAQ Sub-Committee will help estimate scores (DOT will ultimately be scoring)








Full TAC will decide regional ranking







Advancement of our Goals

REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION GOALS

ACCESSIBILITY

Improve access to destinations via

walking, bicycling, and public

transit.

EQUITY & HEALTH

SAFETY

Improve safety for all roadway users, using a Complete Streets approach.

INCREASE FUNDING

Prioritize equity, public health, Ensure the region is competing strongly for state and environmental justice in and federal funding. transportation investments.

BALANCED MOBILITY

ACTION PLAN COMPONENTS:

PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

UVLSRPC staff will provide assistance to project partners with project development, including any needed planning, feasibility, and/or engineering studies; public input; and data collection.

The goal of this process is to develop projects that are ready to compete for funding and be implemented.

PROJECT TIERS

Projects in the Action Plan are assigned to tiers based on level of need and project readiness. Projects in **Tier I** are considered the highest priority and are ready to compete for funding.

Projects can advance to higher tiers by moving through the **Project**Development process. See page 7 for a more detailed descriptions of project tiers.

APPLY FOR FUNDING

UVLSRPC staff will assist partners in identifying and applying for funding for **Tier I** projects.

For some statewide funding sources, the UVLSRPC Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) is asked to rank proposed projects from the region. The TAC will use the Action Plan to inform their review and prioritization of proposed projects.

What does a "non-capital" lens mean?


Address Alternative Modes
