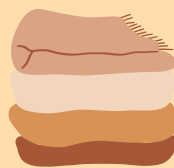
Keep these essential supplies in a waterproof container and in an easy-to-reach spot, so you're ready when it matters most.

Flashlight and batteries

Located in a known, waterproof location and well labeled: make sure everyone in your household is aware of its location!



Flood Emergency Kit

With anticipated flooding, it's important we are prepared. Here are some items to keep in an Emergency Kit in a waterproof area of your house.

Basic Supplies

- Water (1 gallon per person per day for at least 5 days)
- Non-perishable food (7-day supply)
- Flashlights and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Radio (NOAA Weather Radio if possible)
- Cell phone chargers and backup battery
- Extra firewood
- Extra fuel
- Generator
- Multipurpose tool or knife
- Contact list (for if your phone dies)

For Families

- Infant supplies (diapers, formula, bottles, etc.)
- Pet supplies (food, leash, carrier, medications)
- Games, books, or comfort items

Personal Items

- Prescription medications and medical supplies
- Medical history (allergies, prescriptions)
- Important documents (IDs, insurance, bank records) in a waterproof bag
- Cash
- Extra clothing layers
- Personal hygiene items (toothbrush, soap, hand sanitizer, etc.)

Tips

- Inform everyone in your household about what to do in case of flooding
- Store your kit in a waterproof tote or backpack.
- Keep it in a place that's easy to grab in case you need to evacuate quickly.
- Review and update your kit
